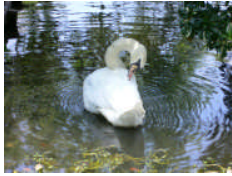


## Who Is The James Team?

The Missions Council is subdivided into several teams: Barnabus, Antioch, Peter, Paul and the James team, which is the local missions team. This team is made up of individuals who have a passion for missions work in and around our community. Most of the mission assignments to various areas and apartment communities consist of a free medical clinic, free food, a clothes closet, and activities for the children. These activities allow for multiple opportunities to share the gospel with the occupants and their families, friends and neighbors.

Our local missions group, the James team, has had several meetings in the past few months trying to determine where our Lord is leading us. We discussed several avenues of service, researched them and many times ran into roadblocks. In the past, the doors were open for Abbey Lane apartments in Summerville, helping at St. George and Pine Gove churches and communities, and Calumet Valley (across from the church). In our eyes, Abbey Lane was the most successful. However, at Calumet Valley, we were introduced to another church, Flowertown, and their local projects: Restoration House and Harvest Home. Several projects were conceived out of this Flowertown meeting. Several people provided supplies and one Sunday School class adopted a room at the Harvest Home (to complete construction and furnish it.). Our most recent mission has been helping with childcare for The Journey Church. This is a new church start in the Jedburg area that is meeting on Sunday evenings from 5:00 to 6:30, therefore, allowing us time to get back to Old Fort for Sunday Night Services. Jim and Nancy Murray have provided leadership for this team but are unable to continue their leadership due to a move to Daniel Island. I (Nancy Murray) am delighted to let you know that Mason Van Tassel has agreed to take over the leadership of the local missions group and I will let him tell you (at a later date) of his thoughts and plans. Thanks to all of you who helped in the past and most especially for those who continue to PRAY for this Mission Team.
